Ai Jiang, age 54, had been in good health and all her laboratory reports had been in normal range. She was surprised

one day in October 2009 when she noted some tiny spots around her belly button. In November, she and her husband visited China for their vacation. When they returned home to California, the swelling of her belly button was larger and the bleeding was worse, but she had only a little discomfort and no serious pain in her abdomen. Early in December, her doctor did a biopsy of that area and it revealed a carcinoma. The doctor also did a colonoscopy, a colon biopsy and a CT scan. The tests revealed a tumor on her transverse colon that was spreading to Ai's liver, as well as to the skin around her belly button.

Ai refused to have an operation. Her husband John, a medical doctor who was aware of the problems of chemotherapy, also refused chemotherapy for her. The couple

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Caregiver Certification Program Strives to Meet Increased Demand

"Do you have the name of a Gerson caregiver in my area?"

Lately, more and more people call the Gerson Institute to ask this question.

Those who have done the Gerson Therapy know how labor intensive it is. They know firsthand how important it is to have a knowledgeable caregiver who can help a Gerson patient and family set up their home. They need someone to teach them or their neighbors, friends or employees how to make the juices, food, special soup, coffee enema solution, and more.

We began our Caregiver Certification Program in 2001 to train new caregivers in the non-medical aspects of the therapy to help meet the increasing number of requests for assistance from Gerson patients. Upon successful completion of the program, caregivers are eligible to be listed on the Gerson Institute Approved Referral List. We then give their names to people who ask for referrals to certified Gerson caregivers in their area (or to caregivers willing to travel). Caregivers work as independent contractors, and help patients set up their homes and get

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report came back that the tissues were dead, malignant tumors. They have the pathology H & E (histological section) slides to show this.

Ai's husband was very impressed because he felt that these releases

provided the best physical proof that her tumors had been malignant and were killed with the help of the Gerson Therapy within two and a half months.

Ai and John realize that simply killing tumor tissue is not the ultimate cure, so she still continues the Gerson Therapy to restore all her body's defenses.

Caregiver Certification Program...

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started on the therapy.

In 2001 we conducted two Caregiver Training classes. Since then, we have greatly expanded the program to include four phases. Phase I begins with attendance at

a Gerson Basics Workshop, now held three times a year. Phase II includes home study. After an interview with a Gerson Institute staff member, prospective caregiver interns enter Phase III: a structured and evaluated internship opportunity in San Diego at either the Charlotte Gerson Health Restoration Center or with our Community Internship Program

for one week. (The four phases are explained in more detail on our website at http://gerson.org/Programs/cert and requirements.htm).


The internship at the Charlotte Gerson Health Restoration Center is a week-long intensive handson training course in all aspects of being a professional Gerson caregiver. Three interns spend 12-hour days cooking and juicing for guests staying at the center and taking classes in all aspects of Gerson caregiving.

Donald Garner successfully completed his internship at the August Restoration Center session and shared his story with us in September:

Question: How did you first find out about the Gerson Therapy?

I was visiting a friend and told him about my father who had cancer. He told me about the Gerson Therapy and its record of success. I went back to Atlanta to take care of my father. I called the Gerson Institute and asked

> for a referral to a certified Gerson caregiver but there was no one in the area. So I asked, "What do I do first?" I bought all of the Gerson Therapy materials online to get started. At that time my father was in the hospital with only 15% kidney function and serious edema issues. They told him the only thing left was dialysis. I read in Charlotte's book. Healing the Gerson



Question: Why did you decide that you want to become certified as a Gerson caregiver?

My father ended up passing on a few weeks later, and I wanted to know why. I attended the Gerson Basics Workshop and realized that if I had known a year ago what I know now, he might still be alive.

I want to be a Gerson caregiver so I have the ability to confidently facilitate someone's drive to be healed from a degenerative disease.

In July, 2010, the Japan Chapter of Cancer Control Society invited us to lecture to their annual convention in Tokyo. We have been attending this event for over a dozen years, so it was also a chance to see some old friends and make new ones.

We addressed a very receptive crowd of about 550 people. The reception was again excellent, helped along by the wonderful presence of a recovered Gerson patient, Mrs. Suzuki, who, although too shy to actually speak to the crowd, stood bravely in front while we described her recovery. After the lecture, several of the medical doctors in the audience came to tell us, "Very interesting speech. I've never thought of it that way."

Our publisher, Mr. Keiichiro Masuda of Jiyusha Publishing, also arranged a separate book signing for

the Japanese translation of Charlotte Gerson and Beata Bishop's Healing the Gerson Way. An enthusiastic crowd of about 50 went away with bags full of books.

Kyoko Ujiie (Abe), who actually did the translation of the book, is a tireless, loyal, and knowledgeable advocate for us in Japan. Her new husband, Koji Abe, a capable journalist in his own right, has started the translation of Dr. Max Gerson: Healing the Hopeless. She assisted us at all our events, including staffing the book sales booth at the convention with Mr. Masuda, where many people purchased the newly published book.

We were also invited to address the senior staff of St.

Marguerite's Hospital in Chiba, where they have been using some elements of the Gerson Therapy to treat patients with chronic illnesses. They had previously engaged Kyoko to teach them Gerson cuisine for their patients and prepared a

wonderful Gerson buffet. heavenly for us in a country where rice, soy, pickled vegetables and deep fried shrimp were so dominant! We had an audience of about 35 of the senior medical. nursing, administrative and dietician staff, who listened very attentively. The senior dietician had already adopted the Gerson diet for herself and her family, and noted the disappearance of many of their medical conditions, so she was delighted to be able to return the favor to us!

Charlotte Gerson's Newest Book



Defeating Obesity, Diabetes and High Blood Pressure: The Metabolic Syndrome by Charlotte Gerson Available Nov. 1, 2010

Charlotte Gerson and Gerson Health Media are pleased to announce the publication of her third book, Defeating Obesity, Diabetes and High Blood Pressure: The Metabolic Syndrome (302 pages) on Nov. 1, 2010. This book is a restatement of the Gerson Therapy specifically aimed at the "Metabolic Syndrome," a rapidly escalating problem not only in the United States, but around the world, as multinational food manufacturers spread their empty, toxic foods and food chemicals to as many countries as possible.

Defeating Obesity is now being translated into Spanish, as well, and we will announce the publication of the Spanish edition as its completion approaches.

The Metabolic Syndrome is a complex of problems centering on obesity that puts people's lives at risk from cancer, diabetes, cardiovascular (heart) disease and stroke, the top four disease killers in the United States and ailments that are becoming a serious problem in other countries. It is estimated that 60% of Americans are obese, with half of those "morbidly" obese (100 lbs.



or more overweight). Obesity shortens a person's lifespan by an average of six to seven years, and annually causes an estimated third of a million excess deaths in the US, and a million excess deaths in Europe.

This volume examines the remedy for the underlying causes of obesity and its constant (and deadly) companions, diabetes and high blood pressure (hypertension).

Many readers will find the concepts and approach to Metabolic Syndrome very similar to those for cancer and other chronic diseases, as they stem directly from the Gerson Therapy. However, those people who are not so immediately at risk from malignant disease will be able to defeat their ailments with a somewhat less stringent approach than cancer patients.

Gerson Basics Workshop



FDA Says Walnuts Are Illegal Drugs

Over the past 17 years, research studies have shown people who eat walnuts have a reduced incidence of heart disease. Apparently walnuts have an interesting combination of fatty acids, including omega-3s, along with fractions contained in Vitamin E (gamma tocopherol) that also improve heart health.

In 1993, a *New England Journal of Medicine* study reported improvement in endothelial (cells lining of blood vessels) function in those who consume



walnuts. In 2004, an American Heart Association study reported a 64% improvement in endothelial function.

As it turns out, walnuts contain various nutrients that keep platelets from clogging blood vessels with atherosclerosis deposits. The U.S. National Library of Medicine database contains 35 peer-reviewed articles supporting claims that walnuts improve blood vessel health and may reduce heart attacks.

In September 2010, William Falcon wrote a thoroughly researched and detailed article about the beneficial properties of walnuts.

The Life Extension journal alone has published 57 articles that describe the health benefits of walnuts! The problem started when Diamond Foods, Inc., a distributor of walnuts, published some of this scientific data on their website. Because of the attention they have received from this publication, the FDA now says that the walnuts sold by Diamond Foods are not foods but are "illegal and unauthorized" drugs! The FDA classified their website claims as "unauthorized health claims" that are "not generally recognized as safe and effective" for the medical conditions referenced, and therefore these "drugs" are now subject to misbranding and to government "seizure and injunction."

The FDA never protects the public against high cholesterol fried foods, meats, and sausages, etc. It never talks about eating healthy foods that improve heart health. The FDA's only concern is that corporations profit from the huge consumption of fast foods and arteryclogging junk foods, such as doublecheese burgers.

Since the aging population in the U.S. is increasing, the pharmaceutical corporations stand to gain tens of billions of dollars on the sales of drugs. If a healthy food is available that reduces that income, Big Pharma would stand to lose. The decision makers at the FDA often come from the pharmaceutical companies and, after a stint in the U.S. government-run FDA, they return to the producers of "health care" (which is, in reality "disease care"). They do not work for the public, who shoulders the huge cost of these often useless and

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dangerous drugs. Scientific data and research are disregarded.

There is some good news. In March 2010, a bipartisan bill was introduced into the House of Representatives called the Free Speech about Science Act (H.R. 4913). It is designed to protect basic free-speech rights and end censorship of truthful, scientific health claims about natural foods and herbs. Of course the FDA, big drug companies and powerful lobbyists oppose the bill. All the more reason for concerned citizens to take action. You can log on to the Life Extension Legislative Action website http://www.lef.org/lac to e-mail your Representative to ask him or her to co-sponsor H.R. 4913 and stop federal agencies from squandering tax dollars censoring what we are allowed to learn about health-promoting foods.

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
